## **Job Descriptions:**

### **Screener**

Screeners are responsible for the security screening of spectators, accredited persons and their personal effects at Pedestrian Screening Areas (PSA) or Occupant Screening Area (OSA) before entry into Olympic Venues and Sites. Screeners will be trained to identify designated prohibited items, operate and monitor magnetometer devices (walk through metal detectors) and conduct secondary screening of pedestrians using handheld metal detection devices. Other duties include secondary screening (visual and hand searches) of bags, confirmation of the validity of Olympic Accreditation Identity Cards. Screeners must present a polite attitude and professional appearance at all times.

### **X-ray Operator**

X-ray Operators will be trained to operate a variety of different sized X-ray machines and to interpret X-ray images for prohibited items at PSAs and OSAs. Other duties include the conduct of secondary screening (visual and hand searches) of goods and bags, complete miscellaneous operator maintenance functions. X-ray Operators must present a polite and professional attitude and appearance at all times.

### **Communication Operator**

The Communications Operators are responsible for monitoring and coordination of communications on the GSS Talk Group (radio network) at Olympic Venues and Sites. Communications Operators report directly to the GSS Venue Manager (VM) and assist the GSS VM coordinate the passage of information from the Police Security Command Centre to GSS Supervisors. Communications Operators must have previous radio dispatch experience.

### **Supervisors**

Supervisors are responsible for the management of GSS operations and the supervision of GSS Operators (Screeners and X-ray Operators) at their assigned Pedestrian Screening Area or Occupant Screening Area Portal. A critical success factor for GSS PSA / OSA operations is effective relationships between the GSS Supervisors, the PSA Police Officer and the VANOC Event Services Supervisor. Supervisors must have 2 years leadership experience in the security, law enforcement or major events industry.

### **Venue Managers**

Venue Managers (VM) are responsible for the operational delivery and contractual requirements for GSS operations at their assigned Venue. This challenging and dynamic role also includes the supervision and management of GSS Supervisors and GSS Operators. VMs will also be expected to develop effective relationships with the Venue Commander, Police Watch NCO and VANOC Venue Management. This position requires 5 years leadership experience in a security or event environment.



## **Job Eligibility Requirements:**

**While qualifications differ for each position, all Contemporary Security Canada employees hired for the Vancouver 2010 Olympic and Paralympic Winter Games must meet the following general requirements:**

- Turn 19 years of age by Nov. 1st, 2009
- Speak and read English fluently (French and additional languages an asset)
- Permitted to work legally in Canada
- Have accommodations in Vancouver or surrounding area during the employment period.
- Enjoy learning new skills, meeting new people, and working within a culturally diverse team and environment
- Prepared to commit for either the month of February or January–March, 2010.
- Attend 24 - 64 hours of paid training between Sept. 2009 and Jan. 2010.
- Security staff will be required to undergo a police criminal background check including fingerprint collection.

All candidates must be able to meet the minimum physical requirements listed below:

- Standing for long periods of time (up to 4 consecutive hours without a break)
- Bending at the waist (up to 30%)
- Squatting (up to 30%)
- Lift up to 25lbs
- Repetitive wrist and hand motion (up to 80%)
- Willing to work in cold and wintery conditions (up to 8 hours per shift)
- Grasping

In addition:

- Excellent communication skills – verbal & written
- Good customer service skills (friendly and outgoing)
- BST (Basic Security Training, formerly BST 1-2) will be highly regarded (not required)

## **ID Requirements**

\*Canadian citizens please bring Government issued photo identification, and proof of citizenship in the form of a valid Canadian Passport, birth certificate or Citizenship Certification Card when you visit the Hiring Centre.

\*Non-Canadian citizens are required to bring in their Passport
